The focus of the learning was sharing learning and successes from Collaboratives, opportunities for leadership, measures of quality improvement and developing concepts of change and PDSA (Plan Do Study Act) cycles.

We were privileged to hear from Shannon and Gina Wetere as members of the Feet for Life Collaborative talking about their experience of care.

Lynne Maher, Director of Innovation at Ko Awatea led a session on patient experience and experience based design which helped focus us on how we can be patient and whanau centred in all our work.

Brandon Bennett ,Improvement Advisor, Faculty Ko Awatea also led sessions for developing Change Concepts and Change Packages and how to measure the work.

Healthy Hearts - Fit to Exercise Graduation Celebration - 18 December 2013




Kia Kaha, Manage Better, Feel Strong

Early successes are showing for people on the Kia Kaha programme. The graph is showing that (based on current adjustments) that post Kia Kaha intervention the people present at Emergency Care 0.85 compared to pre intervention (ie a 15% decrease). Patient 3 is known to the service and was expected to be an outlier as they are now engaging more with their health - excluding this person the rate drops to 0.65.



Feet for Life Dashboard:

There were no amputations in the month of October. The average wait time for Podiatrist to be seen is now 1 day compared to around 6 weeks.
