

Change Package

	Change Tested	Outcome / Evidence of Improvement
1	Multidisciplinary team support to facilitate achieving shared quality and safety goals.	Virtual clinics and MDT meetings established. Additional targeted interventions are offered for those who would benefit most. POAC/DCIP/ARI/SME
2	Setting the direction for improving quality and safety consistent with organisational and national goals. Lack of communication is a safety issue.	All staff meetings are held on a monthly basis to allow each member of the practice team a voice in organisational plans/audits that have a key influence on quality and safety within the clinic.
3	Improvement is evidence-based and data-driven. If it is not measured we cannot mange it.	Decisions are made on evidence rather than beliefs and perceptions.






























The Future

- e-consult (structured history analysis)
