 Changes in organisation

## **Trigger Tool**

- Discussion with peers/clinic meeting
- Monitoring
- Doctors encouraged to do trigger tool in peer review or individually























# **Highlights**

- Team work + improved communication (recall + reminders to update changes)
- Cooperation from staff improved
- Patients appreciate contact from clinic /follow up
- Ongoing system + process established –PDSA cycle
- Patient safety language
- Improve EDS from A+ DHB and Waitemata DHB- needs to be clearer ( CMDHB EDS very clear)

## Lowlights

- Nurse allocated time for follow up contact
- Aim to reduced pharmacy phone calls overall
- Documentation of changes in notes
- Time to complete Climate Survey, Trigger Tool and Audits
