THE HEEADSSS ASSESSMENT

20 FEBRUARY, 20 MARCH, 24 JULY, 21 AUGUST

A one day introduction to clinical practice in youth health including: communication & engagement in youth health & development & using the HEEADSSS assessment model.

WHO SHOULD ATTEND? Anyone working with young people.

WHAT COMES AFTER HEEADSSS?

7 JUNE, 20 SEPTEMBER

This one day course gives an introduction to intervention skills when working with young people such as problem solving, motivational interviewing and discussing principles of behaviour change in young people.

WHO SHOULD ATTEND? Those who have completed the HEEADSSS Assessment training.

WORKING WITH TRANSGENDER CHILDREN & YOUNG PEOPLE

A one day introduction to working with gender diverse young people. The full day workshop will cover assessment including supporting exploration of gender identity, options for gender affirming medical care, links to resources

POSTGRADUATE STUDY IN YOUTH HEALTH

CLINICAL YOUTH HEALTH (PAEDS 712)

Semester One: Core skills in youth health including: effective engagement, assessment & intervention skills for working with young people in a range of clinical or community settings. This course has some content on line, with 3 contact days.

POPULATION YOUTH HEALTH (POPLHLTH 732)

Semester One: This course aims to prepare students for a role in youth health in a variety of locations and sectors. In doing this, students are exposed to current research and practice relating to population youth health and evidence-based health care. This course is taught with a blend of on-line and on campus delivery (1 day).

YOUTH CARE PRACTICUM (PAEDS 722)

Semester One or Two: In 2018 there will be a structured practicum offered in semester 1—*Adolescent and young adult cancer*. This is designed to be taken alongside PAEDS 712. Other options for practicums developed by students can be undertaken following discussion with academic staff.

HEALTH, EDUCATION AND YOUTH DEVELOPMENT (PAEDS 719)

Semester Two: This course offers insights and strategies to work with young people in the rapidly developing health and education sector interface. In 2016 it will be taught with a blend of on-line and on campus delivery (2 days). This course is highly relevant for health professionals working in schools.

YOUTH HEALTH THEORY, APPLICATION & LEADERSHIP (PAEDS 720) NOT OFFERED IN 2018

Semester Two: This course aims to extend participants knowledge of youth health and well-being and prepare participants for leadership roles in youth health.

NEW COURSE IN 2018! CLINICAL CARE OF TRANSGENDER AND GENDER DIVERSE YOUNG PEOPLE (PAEDS 710)

Semester One: This course is for health professionals who care for transgender and gender diverse young people. You will develop and advance your skills, knowledge and expertise in the clinical care of transgender and gender diverse young people. The course will cover the epidemiology and development of transgender and gender diverse identity in children and young people; How to best assess and support transgender and gender diverse identity in children and young people; In-depth aspects of the medical and surgical care of transgender and gender diverse young people; Ethical and management issues in caring for transgender and gender diverse young people. The course is delivered over three one day block sessions and one half day for case presentations. This course requires that students have previously completed PAEDS712 or are currently enrolled in PAEDS712
